

## **Instructions for Circulating Sue Rezin's Petitions**

1. You must personally witness all signatures made on this petition.
2. You may circulate petitions even if you have not voted in a previous election at all, or have not voted in a previous Republican primary election, or even if you previously voted in a Democrat Primary.
3. You may sign your own petition if you are a registered voter within the district but you may not notarize your own petition.
4. You may pass this petition anywhere in the 14<sup>th</sup> Congressional District.
5. You may not circulate petitions for more than one political party, even if they are for different offices.
6. Petitions with fewer than 15 names **do count**. If you are not able to complete all lines on a petition, please do send in your petition. Each name counts.
7. If you learn a signature is not valid, do not worry. Bad signatures do not knock out other good signatures or invalidate a petition. HOWEVER, known bad signatures should be brought to the attention of the campaign, so that they can be officially deleted. A circulator who routinely disregards the signature gathering rules may have an entire sheet stricken even though some signatures are valid.
8. You must sign as the circulator of the petition before a Notary Public licensed in Illinois and the Notary Public must affix his/her seal or stamp. Most banks and libraries will notarize free of charge. The "county of \_\_\_\_\_" listed on the petition is the county where you sign before a notary.
9. DO NOT number the petition page.

### **Instructions for Petition Signers:**

1. You must be a registered voter in the 14<sup>th</sup> Congressional District of Illinois. It does not matter which primaries you voted in for past elections.
2. Please sign your name as you are registered to vote. For example, Elizabeth R. Smith, not Liz Smith.
3. DO NOT use ditto marks for any part of an address or county.
4. You must use the address where you are registered to vote. Post Office boxes are not allowed.
5. You MAY NOT sign petitions for candidates of more than one political party in the same election.
6. You CANNOT sign another person's name on a petition.
